#### The Minister writes:

I have been fascinated to hear about different traditions that families used to keep around Whitsuntide. For many it meant a new set of clothes; an outfit that became the 'Sunday Best' for the rest of the year. Some were given a pen while for others a pair of white socks were always given. In many communities there was a Whit walk; a parade through the village, often with people wearing their best clothes and the ladies in White. This would end with an open air service and celebration.

What lies behind these celebrations is the commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit on the early disciples at Pentecost. When the Holy Spirit came on Jesus at his baptism, He appeared as a white dove. Whit is derived from white and this is why white clothing has been popular at this time.

The exciting thing about this festival is that it reminds us of a great event that happened long ago, but that is just as relevant today. I am encouraged to hear many stories of people experiencing the Holy Spirit here in Stanley in many different ways.



We can receive the Holy Spirit today and he will make an amazing difference to our lives. He puts the spotlight on Jesus, and encourages our relationship with Him. For some their experience of the Holy Spirit has led them to faith. He also helps us be transformed into the likeness of Christ, disturbing us and making us discontent until we ask God's help to change. He also empowers us for serving one another. The Gifts of the spirit make us helpful and useful for our community. There are many people who have received healing and comfort through prayer, other's who have experienced God's love and presence in a tangible way.

We may not get a new set of clothes now, but we can receive a fresh blessing from the Holy Spirit. How do we receive? Its simple, we just ask. Go on give it a try, you will never regret it.





### Profile of local charity Wakefield District Sight Aid

Wakefield District Sight Aid is a longstanding local charity (founded in 1869) which supports blind and partially sighted people across the Wakefield District. It provides a range of support, specialist advice and equipment to enable people to live their lives as independently and safely as possible.

Over 2,500 people in the district are registered as visually impaired and WDSA is in contact with around 1,000 of these every year and is the only local charity offering direct support to the visually impaired in Wakefield.

Some of the activities undertaken by the charity are:

- Assessment of home safety, and help with obtaining equipment for the home e.g. talking clocks, magnifiers, large button telephones, tactile marking etc.
- Walking aids to help people get around safely.
- Information and advice about other support agencies.
- Regular communication via newsletter on local and national issues
- Telephone support line operated by volunteers

The charity also holds six demonstration days every year, providing an opportunity for visually impaired people, their carers and family to see the latest equipment and get advice and information.

These demonstration days are held from 10.30am—2pm at the Parkside Centre (address above) and are open to all members of the public, whether visually impaired or not. The next demonstration days are: 20th June, 15th August, 3rd October, 28th November.

The charity will also be visiting St Peter's church lunch club on Tuesday 21st June from 11am-12pm. This would be a great opportunity to come and find out more about the charity and the services they offer.

The charity receives little central financial support and is highly dependent on donations, collections, legacies and fundraising events.



David Winter recalls Kitchener' iconic poster of WW1....

#### The greatest poster ever?

Hundreds of thousands of young men saw it. Indeed, they could hardly miss it. The poster was everywhere – a stern-faced distinguished figure and, most prominently, a finger pointing straight at them. Below it were the words, 'YOU - Join your country's army!'

The year was 1914 and Britain was at war. Our army needed recruits in huge numbers, to be trained and then sent across the English Channel to the battle-fields of southern Belgium and



France. Lord Kitchener, who died a hundred years ago this month, was a hero from the Boer War and now the Secretary of State for War.

The idea of the poster had developed from a newspaper advertisement which read 'Your King and Country Needs You' by way of hand-bills to a full-size poster. It was Kitchener himself who proposed making it a personal appeal to 'Britons' to 'join the country's Army'. They did join the army, in huge numbers, and it was not until 1916, following massive casualties in France and in the Battle of the Somme in particular, that conscription had to be introduced. The poster has subsequently had many imitators, but no equals in emotional impact.

The Battle of the Somme took place between 1st July and 18th November 1916 and was the largest battle of World War 1 on the Western Front. The Somme Offensive was meant to be a decisive allied breakthrough, but turned into a horrendous stalemate that became a byword for indiscriminate slaughter. By the end of just the first day, the British had suffered 60,000 casualties, of whom 20,000 were dead. During the entire Somme conflict, more than 1 million men were wounded or killed, making it one of the bloodiest battles in human history.

Communities across the UK are to hold vigils to mark the centenary of the battle on the evenings of 30th June or 1st July. The Government and the Royal British Legion are inviting villages, towns and cities to organise remembrance events to take place alongside national and international commemorations.
