Update from Stanley Residents Group

We are coming towards the end of another busy year but it's not over yet! We still have **Santa comes to Stanley on 7th December** when all our local children receive a free gift from Santa himself. This will be at Stanley Community Centre and organised by our

local Councillors. There will also be lots of stalls, games and activities organised by local community groups and charities, so it will be a great event.

Our most exciting project for November will be giving the garden at Cross Keys on the junction of Lake Lock Road and Mount Road a whole new makeover as it has been neglected for far too long since the building was closed. The flower beds will be completely stripped and replanted with new soil and plants. The whole tarmac area needs work too to make it look tidy. SRG appealed on our Facebook page for help with this task and we are immensely grateful to those who responded so quickly offering their equipment and time for free.

The plants have been carefully chosen to cope with the weather conditions at that corner and to avoid them outgrowing their space. Any not donated will be bought using money we were awarded through the COOP Community Fund for improving the village (money raised BY the community FOR the community!). 

Dear Friends,

In the month when we think about those who have given their lives in war, the Two Minutes Silence is a significant act of remembrance. The silence provides an opportunity to remember those who have suffered in war and how we can work for a peaceful world. However, we can also find ourselves thinking about lunch or whether we've switched off our phone?

Victor Frankl, a victim of Auschwitz, suggested that the most intolerable of all human conditions is not imprisonment or hunger, but lack of meaning. The two minutes of silence enables us to connect with Jesus' message, which offers true meaning to our lives and world. He spoke of giving ourselves in love for each other and the world: 'Love your enemies and pray for those that persecute you' (Matthew 5:44). He also demonstrated such love in sacrificing His own life: 'Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends' (John 15:13). When observing the silence this year on Remembrance Sunday, let's use it to reflect on this sacrificial love, as we call to mind those who have laid down their lives.

In our busy lives, where so much clamours for our attention, silence gives us an opportunity to reflect on our priorities and rediscover true meaning in our lives. This is not just for Remembrance Sunday, as Jesus often withdrew to find silence to seek God (e.g. Luke 5:16). Let's use silence in our lives as space to seek God's will and offer ourselves to Him, just as those who gave themselves in conflict through the years.

I will leave you with this famous verse from Laurence Binyon's longer poem, 'For the Fallen' which he wrote in September 1914, just one month after the outbreak of WW1. Binyon was in his early forties, and therefore too old for active service, and wrote the poem while sitting on the cliffs of Cornwall near Polzeath. A plaque was erected in 2001 to mark the spot, and reads "For the Fallen, composed on these cliffs, 1914":

They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.

Please join us this Remembrance Sunday, as we remember, for two short minutes, the sacrifices made by those who gave their lives in war, and also Jesus's sacrificial love for all mankind.
