Wednesday 7th December, 5pm-7pm



### **Update from Stanley Residents Group**

Alongside the Christmas spirit, community spirit also brings plenty of peace and joy, and it has been a bumper year for that with the Stanley Residents' Group in 2022! Volunteers have worked hard on the group's usual activities, including the summer gala, vegetable,

flower and baking show, scarecrow trail, litter picks, youth club, Stanley Facebook page, noticeboards, community gardens, spring bulbs and organising the hanging baskets. In addition, this year the group also facilitated the late Queen's Jubilee celebration in Stanley in June, involving a street parade, miles of bunting around the village, and a fete in Stanley St Peter's school. The rain did not prevent many local groups, schools, businesses, pubs, families and residents coming together for some fun, supported by Co-op and National Lottery funding.

SRG volunteers also extensively developed the community orchard on Mount Road this year and created new community garden spaces and plantings at the Cross Keys centre and Lime Pit Lane. The number of regular volunteers has expanded, and many others help out now and then or offer their support in different ways. It has been especially good to work on projects alongside many other great volunteer groups and businesses in Stanley.

Everyone is welcome to join the meetings, to bring new ideas, come to events and join in the volunteering. There is plenty more planned for 2023, including the heritage trail and trail boards, Stanley St Peter's Community Memorial garden, new community benches, a new website and more, all aimed at improving our local environment and bringing people together.

Our AGM is on **Monday January 9th at 6.30pm** in the Thatched House pub, where we will be electing new officers of the committee. A further meeting will be held on **January 19th at 6.30pm** to plan the year's activities. Do come along!

Many thanks to everyone who came along to last month's coffee morning; it raised an incredible £327! The next coffee mornings will be held on Saturday 10th December and 14th January from



# Newsletter for Dec '22 & Jan '23



**Dear Friends,** Well, it is finally happening! Next month, a moving van will arrive to take Mother Jo and I to our new home in Batley, and a new start for me as priest-in-charge of four churches: All Saints' Batley, St Thomas' Batley, St Andrew's Purlwell and St Paul's Hanging Heaton. It will be a big change and a big challenge. We have been blessed to get to know so many people in our six years in Outwood and Wrenthorpe. You have welcomed us into your homes and shared your lives with us, and we have been so grateful for the love and hospitality you have shown us.

There are two things that I think make for a healthy church: taking what we do seriously and also being serious about the people we do it for. I believe in a welcoming church which expects and plans for people of all ages and backgrounds to come along, as well as in a church which is faithful to the traditions that have shaped us as Christians and which we hope to pass on to the next generation. That is the kind of ministry I have tried to have in St Mary Magdalene's, St Anne's and the wider North Wakefield Team, and which I hope to carry to Batley. The challenge is a big one: all four of my new churches are small, with an average of only around 80 or 90 people going to church across the team. The team covers a diverse area, with many families who trace their roots to India and Pakistan, but there are healthy interfaith links and lots of community work going on.

One of the things which encourages me most about the North Wakefield Team as I leave it is that there is so much good which has been done in the last year, and a great deal of it has been led by the people of our churches, rather than the clergy. Whether its the Youth Drop in at St Anne's, the Drop-In and Lunch Club in St Mary Magdalene's, the reopened Ark in St Peter's or the Warm Spaces initiative in St Paul's, there is so much going on which comes about because of the hard work of parishioners. I hope and pray all these things carry on and grow in the coming years - it was very encouraging to discover the Gardening Club in St Mary Magdalene's had been awarded a large grant from the Bishops' Development Fund to continue its work.

Of course, the clergy DO have a role to play, and I shall miss the company and fellowship of Glenn, David and Stuart, as well as all the lay ministers. I have learned a lot in my time with you all and I wish you all every blessing in the months and years to come.

So it's farewell from me, good luck for the future, and the blessing of God almighty go always with us.



### A Back to Front Advent Calendar



### 90 years of broadcasting the Royal Christmas message

This year we shall have our first Royal Christmas Message from King Charles III. He follows in a tradition that spans three generations. It was 90 years ago, on 25th December 1932, that the first Royal Christmas Message was broadcast on radio. King George V addressed the nation live from Sandringham. A quarter of a century later, on 25th December 1957, the Christmas message by Queen Elizabeth II was televised for the first time.

King George V had been asked to broadcast a Christmas message in 1922, but at the time he felt that radio was for entertainment, and therefore not suitable. Ten years later, after a visit to the BBC, he was persuaded otherwise, and agreed to do it as part of the inauguration of the new Empire Service (now the World Service).

The time chosen was 3pm because it was the best time for reaching most countries in the Empire. In fact the first message started five minutes late and lasted only two and a half minutes, but it made a massive impact and established itself as a regular Christmas Day event.

Edward VIII never delivered a Christmas broadcast, but King George VI continued the tradition, using it to en-

courage people during the second world war. Queen Elizabeth II broadcast her first Christmas message in 1952, again from a room at Sandringham, and five years later agreed that her Christmas message could be televised – live. She proved to be a natural broadcaster.

But times changed, and in1960 the message was pre-recorded from Buckingham Palace, which meant that it could be sent to Commonwealth countries for broadcast at a convenient time. However, the 3pm UK broadcast continued every year – except 1969, when the Queen wrote a message instead, believing that the Royal Family had received enough exposure with the TV documentary Royal Family, which had aired in the summer.

But the tradition was resumed the following year. The Christmas message is now also available each year as a podcast and can be seen through Facebook and YouTube. King Charles III is expected to give his first Christmas message this year.

### The mysterious ways of Mistletoe

Mistletoe has long been used as part of our Christmas decorations, but it is an unusual kind of plant. It is hemiparasitic, meaning that although its leaves enable it to feed itself through photosynthesis, its roots invade the host tree or shrub to extract water and other nutrients.

Mistletoe loves living in apple, lime, hawthorn, poplar or oak trees. You may spot it high up, as a large globe, on the bare trees in winter. There is one spectacular example in Windsor Great Park, clearly visible from the path on the opposite side of the Thames.

Mistletoe's berries are almost translucent, fleshy and sticky. They form in the forks of mistletoe's many branches. While they are toxic to humans, they are attractive to birds, who wipe the remaining seeds off their beaks onto the nearest branch, which of course helps the plant to spread.

For some reason, Romans thought mistletoe represented Peace, Love and Understanding. Perhaps that is how it got into our Christmas celebrations? The earliest documentary evidence for kissing under mistletoe dates from the 16th century, but we don't know who got kissed first.


### Christmas Fair— a review
