

A review of the 50th Anniversary Service for the Lofthouse Pit Disaster

On Saturday 18th March there was a very moving service at Outwood church to remember the 7 miners who perished at the Lofthouse colliery 50 years ago.

Bishop Tony Robinson gave the address and Councillor Denise Jeffery, leader of Wakefield Council, did a Bible reading. The daughter of miner Edward Finnegan who died in the disaster gave a very moving recollection of the events that day; there was also a poem 'Men Without Fear', and candles were lit by the families in memory of those that died.

The City of Sheffield Steel and Miners Pipe Band was also in attendance, and after the service there were speeches and food at Outwood Memorial Hall, along with performances by Lofthouse 2000 Brass Band, and Skelmanthorpe Male Voice Choir.



The Lofthouse Pit Disaster 21st March, 1973

Some of us can remember only too well those terrible days 50 years ago and the tragedy of the Lofthouse Pit disaster. St Paul's congregation did their part, providing hot food, drinks and prayer to the many men from the various pits who fought tooth and nail to rescue the men trapped underground. We also remember the memorial 10 years ago at the pit disaster plinth on Batley Road and the special service that was held in church, with many men from the pit telling their personal and moving stories.

This year it is the 50th anniversary of the disaster, and after the short memorial service on Batley Road on Sunday 19th March led by Bishop Tony Robinson, St Paul's once again opened it's arms and welcomed the families into the church. During the gathering, Nicola Harrison, whose dad Edward Finnegan died in the disaster, spoke very movingly abut the impact of his death on the family, both at the time and during the years since. All the men who lost their lives, and their families, continue to be in our prayers and thoughts.

Special thanks to Pam Brockbank who found the 1973 April parish magazine which contained a touching piece written by Rev Maurice Turner who was vicar at the time. He had also worked as a miner and wrote:

"This Bevin Boy of three years, three months experience – 'a gentleman
